Next, Jeff Queen, a featured soloist for the awardwinning broadway show BLAST!, will amaze you with a snare drum clinic. Tim Genis is the assistant timpanist for the Boston Symphony Orchestra and he will present a timpani clinic. Mr. Genis will describe what it is like to play for a major orchestra. Robert van Sice, the world-renowned marimba artist, will present a master class and members of the audience will be invited to join Mr. van Sice on stage for one-on-one instruction. Bob Gullotti will change gears quite a bit and give a drum set clinic. Mr. Gullotti is a sensational jazz drummer you simply must hear. Feeling in the mood to participate in a samba class? Well, Eduardo Leandro will lead a drum circle that will teach you how to play Brazilian Samba.
